Committee Reports:

Grants (Lori Hollasch)

The committee was very impressed with the variety of teacher grants applied for. As two thirds of the students are members of the school band the music department has received a grant for a new tuba.

A motion to approve up to \$11, 488.78 for classroom and school wide grants was proposed by Bill Blakely. The motion was voted upon and approved.

Membership (Cathy Renner)

The current PTSA membership for CKMS is 78%. All faculty and staff have received donated membership from parents.

Directory (Connie Rosenberger)

The directory should be ready for parents after Thanksgiving.

Poinsettias (Linda Shaw)

Sales ended November 4th. A total of 178 plants have been sold. The pick up date is November 30th.

There will be a table of Hawk Wear at the Parent Conferences selling both current and previous years' clothing. Kristin needs extra volunteers.

School Dances (Cathy Renner)

The PTSA dances have been very successful with attendance up on last year.

Book Fair (Kara Spalding)

The Book Fair is now open in the library and will run until November 23rd.

To date 124 books have been sold with a value of \$1400.

Winter Carnival (Stephanie Ploof)

The Winter Carnival will be held January 21st. Volunteers are still needed.

Raffle (Cathy Renner)

4,000 tickets will go on sale for the raffle. 50 raffle items are still needed.

Art Gallery (Mo Pfister)

The new mural for the library has been voted for by the students. The Art Club have begun work on the mural.

Bond Proposal: Dan Schlotfeldt and Lori Hollasch

The District School Board has approved a resolution to place a 20-year bond for \$56.2 million to put before Snoqualmie Valley voters on February 8th. This will provide funding to build a replacement middle school to open in the fall of 2013, when Snoqualmie Middle School will be converted to a Freshman Learning Center as part of Mount Si High School. The bond will also provide several building upgrades to existing schools, and allow for program improvements at the high school (such as adding a STEM program for integrated Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics instruction).

A motion for CKMS PTSA to endorse the bond was proposed by Maggie Grate. The motion was voted upon and approved.

A motion for the CKMS PTSA to give \$350 financial support to the Valley Voters for Education was proposed by Bill Blakely. The motion was voted upon and approved.
